George and Joy Harper, senior citizens, became our friends at Forest Baptist Church. Both were devout believers who actively served the Lord and became Doorkeepers. We became instant friends when we shared a table at a fellowship at the church. They were new members of FBC. I was delighted to meet them personally having been blessed by one of the most beautiful piano renditions from Joy that I had ever heard. The worship service came alive and one could think only of true worship to the Father. She was in the concert pianist classification for sure.

As we began to talk, learning about one another, we found that Joy's lifelong love of playing the piano began at age ten. She was a graduate of the University of Texas. Joy initiated a different direction for the conversation. I will tell you our love story. The story began during the World War II era. She married her high school sweetheart, David Hensley, but became a WWII widow by the age of 20. David served in the United States Air Force as the nose gunner on a B24. It was there that

he became acquainted with George Harper, who hailed from Connecticut and was navigator on David's plane. On January 1, 1945, their plane took German flak while on a mission in the Battle of the Bulge. George navigated back into safe territory in France, where he was injured after landing with a too-small parachute. Only the nose gunner, David Hensley, died. George, who had become a World War II hero, was with him.

Upon returning home, George traveled from his home state of Connecticut to Texas to pay his respects to Joy, David's young widow. They fell in love. After a courtship by mail, they married in 1947 and had 69 years together until he left for his eternal home on Sunday, September 18, 2016 at the age of ninety-four. Among our memories of George was his special handshake, accompanied by a warm greeting, of Joy sitting at the piano with fingers moving up and down the keys producing heavenly music, sitting with a twinkle in her eyes and a smile on her face. Both were very interested in the prayer seminar ministry, especially in the extensive international outreach.

As she waited to join her beloved in Heaven, Joy remained faithful even when playing the piano was difficult. She was a beautiful lady. As her health declined, many of our **Doorkeepers** prayed for her every day until the day of her exodus came and she stepped into Heaven to join George together forever in the blessed land of unending day.

Joy found great joy in accompanying others, whether at church (beginning in high school), USO (during World War II), and in

her later years at Forest Baptist Church and with the Senior Life Choir from Thomas Road Baptist Church. Over her lifetime, the Lord nourished within her all the Fruits of the Spirit, not only through her musical talents but also through her gift of hospitality, her servant's heart and her quick-witted sense of humor. She loved her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ with all her heart and soul and might, which was evident when she often ended her prayers with, "We love you Lord, help us to love you more."

We received a letter, following Joy's death, from the executor of the Harper Estate sharing that JGHM was to be a beneficiary but it would probably be the middle of the 2021 summer before the estate would be settled and checks distributed. Actually, I filed the letter and thought nothing more about it. On July 1, 2021, we received a registered letter from Shelbyville, Kentucky. The amount was \$35,842.74. At a time when we were considering the future of JGHM, it was as though the Lord said, "We are not through using JGHM as an agent through which My children can channel support touching other nations through mobilizing and equipping believers to become Lighthouses of Prayer." Coupled with similar evidence, it is likely JGHM will continue through my lifetime and perhaps beyond.

The God to Whom We Pray

During the past few issues of the **Reflector**, we have devoted considerable space for teaching on God is on the thesis that knowing God intimately must first begin by knowing who He is as revealed in the written Word of God. The feedback has confirmed that our readers have appreciated the material that we have shared. Now I believe that it will be helpful to make application to our prayer lives of what we have discussed.

In my role as a college teacher/administrator and executive-director for the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (1984-1995) I was often drawn to the book of Nehemiah for leadership principles to share with colleagues for which I was responsible for supervising and presidents of the institutions associated with TRACS, Nehemiah has often been my exemplar model since he demonstrates power in prayer and skillfully leading the people to rebuild the wall in 52 days.

As a servant (cupbearer) to King Artaxerxes of Persia, he had no right to request leave to rebuild Jerusalem's walls, much less to requisition materials and protection. Yet knowing the nature of the God he served, Nehemiah did not hesitate to act boldly and ask the king for what was needed. Read **Nehemiah 1:1-11**

to join in the study.

Nehemiah's prayer began, "I beseech You, O LORD God of heaven" (v 5). LORD, when it appears in all capital letters, denotes the word Jehovah (a form of Yahweh, the Hebrew name for God). It means "God who is eternal in His being"—conveying that everywhere is in His presence. So, when God makes a promise, He knows how He will keep it in every situation. That is why Nehemiah called Him "the awesome God who preserves the covenant." He knew God was committed to bringing repentant Israelites back to their homeland to dwell in His presence (v 9).

Another Hebrew name used to refer to God, Elohim, is translated "He who is absolutely sovereign." If He spoke the world into being (and He did that very thing!), then He is certainly more than able to provide Nehemiah with supplies, some time off from work, and favor from the Persian king.

There are many other names for God, such as Adonai ("Master"), Jehovah-Jireh ("Provider"), and Jehovah-Rapha ("Healer"). Since the Hebrew language is precise, it can help us to better know who He is—when we need solace, we call upon the God of comfort; in our confusion, we have the God who teaches. Just as knowing one's audience affects our choice of words to speak, we way we view God impacts how we pray.

Standing orders

Year by year, day by day, moment by moment, a Christian has standing orders concerning joy, prayer, and thanksgiving given by Paul and recorded in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18. These standing orders represent the will of God in Christ Jesus for believers, for you and me who are Christians. The words "in Christ Jesus" remind us that He taught us these things during His earthly ministry and He was the living embodiment of what He taught. By teaching and by example, He revealed to us God's will concerning the three standing orders.

5:16. "Rejoice always." Joy can be the constant experience of the Christian, even in the most adverse circumstances, because Christ is the source and subject of his joy, and Christ is in control of the circumstances.

5:17. "Pray." Prayer should be the constant attitude of the Christian not that he abandons his regular duties and gives himself wholly to prayer. He prays at certain regular times; he always prays extemporaneously as need arises; and he enjoys continual communion with the Lord by prayer as he moves through the day,

5:18. "Thanksgiving." Giving thanks to God should be the Christian's native emotion. Because everything works together for good (Romans 8:28), we can praise the Lord at all times, in all circumstances, and for everything.

Let everything that hath breath praise the LORD. Praise ye the LORD. **Psalm 150:6**

The prophet Isaiah, in one of his greatest Messianic passages, proclaimed that one of the gifts of the Messiah will be the garment of praise which we will receive in exchange for the spirit of heaviness.

Every child of God has a garment of praise in his closet. How unfortunate it is that so many of us push the flattering and eye-catching garment to the back and refuse to wear it. Praising the Lord is both our responsibility and our privilege. It is a task that is not confined to the elite or to the intelligentsia or even to the spiritually mature. In fact, the psalmist says that every breathing soul is to praise the LORD.

Your praise will not change God. As Matthew Henry noted long ago, God will never be any greater than He already is. Praise changes us and causes us to love and trust Him more and more.

Remembering Dr. Daniel Mercaldo

August 9, 1939 January 7, 2021 Staton Island, New York Bonita Springs, Florida



Dan Mercaldo was a man sent from God to New York City to lead in the building of Gateway Cathedral, one of the largest evangelical churches on Staten Island, if not the largest. I found the name chosen for the local assembly of believers quite intriguing and refreshing. During my tenure at Northeastern Bible College, Essex Fells, New Jersey, I conducted prayer seminars three consecutive years at Gateway Cathederal with hundreds attending. Not only did the people respond to the content of the prayer seminar, many came to Christ trusting Jesus as Savior and Lord, thus the church was truly a Gateway. The unction of the Holy Spirit was so strong that once the invitation began people came to the altar by droves. One Sunday, after the third morning worship service it was reported that counselors were still dealing with people at 2:30 that afternoon.

Dan, himself, was on the Executive Committee for the National Association of Evangelicals. He was winsome, reflecting a pastor's heart. I was blessed to be with him and his people. He was founder and senior pastor of Gateway Cathedral for more than five decades. He and his

wife Evangeline were married for over sixty-two years.



During my second visit, Pastor Dan—whom I had learned to love, respect, and admire—said, "I've been trying to figure you out!" I responded, "Well, have you?" His answer was, "Yes, I have. You just believe the Word of God. Many guest speakers come here and we don't know whether they really believe the Word of God or not!"

Doesn't this give you a glimpse into the power of the Word itself? I think so. You and I do not need to be taught the latest philosophies. We don't need someone to catch us up on the latest news. We need to hear a Word from God. God speaks out of His Word. None of us will ever have a word to share until we first hear from Him. The written Word of God is His voice speaking to us.

He was a true man of God; throughout his life he pastored several churches and was continuously involved in the ministry of Jesus Christ. He enjoyed gardening and raising birds, but most of all spending time with his grandchildren and great-grandchildren whom he loved unconditionally. "Excerpted from Obituary.



Dr. Hengoed delighted in reading and sharing the Word of God. Praise was readily on his lips. Until the very end, he would

raise his hands in worship and submission. To him prayer was as natural as breathing. To spend time with Dr. Hengoed and Joyce (September 26, 1924-February 4, 2013) in their Hudson, Florida home, was a highlight in my life and career. Their interest in the prayer seminar ministry could not have been stronger. Sue and I were "at home" when we were with Dr. Hengoed and Joyce.

As noted in his death notice, Dr. Hengoed was an educator serving as professor at Harvard University, Boston University, and Jersey City State College (where he ended his career as a Distinguished Professor and nationally recognized reading specialist). He was an adjunct professor at **Northeastern Bible College**. It was at the latter institution that he came into my life and friendship in the fall of 1980.

For eight of the eleven years (1984-1995) that I served as Executive Director for the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS) Dr. Hengoed was chairman of the Accreditation Commission. We traveled the nation together working with Christian institutions of higher learning whose leadership believed in biblical inerrancy, biblical authority, and the historicity of the first eleven chapters of Genesis, including creation not evolution. Dr. Hengoed was my right arm in developing and implementing an accreditation process on the level of other recognized agencies. Founders included Dr. Henry M. Morris (who was chairman of the Board of Directors during my tenure), Dr. Robert Witty (who gave TRACS its name), Dr. Paige Patterson, Dr. Tim LaHaye, Dr. Gene Williams, Dr. Earl Mills, and Dr. Woodrow Kroll. Dr. James Flanagan, Dr. William Bowden, and others were invaluable in refining and strengthening the accreditation process.

A major goal was to be recognized by the U. S. Department of Education as an approved accrediting agency thereby providing access to students in TRACS' colleges to quality for the federal student assistance programs and to enhance transferability of credit to other accredited institutions and to be accepted in graduate programs. There was tremendous opposition to recognizing an accrediting agency whose leaders believe in creationism. The prevailing attitude was that anyone who believed God created the world was too naïve to be a true educator. Dr. Hengoed's impeccable credentials, along with others, made a tremendous difference in our respectability. TRACS received recognition on July 26, 1991 and is now widely accepted as an outstanding accrediting agency. Only eternity will unveil the impact of Dr. Hengoed, Dr. Morris and others (too numerous to list) to provide students an education for time and eternity.

And the beat goes on, as a popular saying goes. Here in the Baltimore area, Adam has recently introduced the prayer seminar to the Baltimore East Gideon camp. Adam noted that they have the Prayer Seminar Workbook and are coming together to talk about a prayer seminar with their leadership. Remember prayer is the work that must come before all other work for the Lord including distributing **Bibles**. During our time in Murfreesboro, Tennessee, we had the privilege of friendship with one of the Gideon International staff members in their national office. 

A beautiful benediction "He is able"

Jude closes his short epistle with a beautiful benediction. Verse 24 is the ascription of praise and worship to Him who is able. As I begin a prayer seminar, I have my students to write at the very top of page 1 three sentences to serve as background for all that I teach. Then I have them in unison affirm the lesson repeating three times so the concepts will lodge in their minds available to undergird the teaching. God is able! God is willing! God is waiting! When we bought a van for Martin to use in his work in Kenya and other East/Central Africa nations. he arranged to have them inscribed on the front and rear windows.

God is able to save (Hebrews 7:25), able to establish (Romans 16:25), able to aid (Hebrews 2:18), able to subdue (Philippians 3:21), here in Jude able to keep. He is able to keep that which I have committed to Him until that Day (2 Timothy 2:1). He is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think (Ephesians 3:20), and He is able to keep us from stumbling. This latter promise is especially timely for the days of apostasy to which Jude is referring.

But the promise doesn't stop there. He is able to make us stand faultless in the presence of His glory with exceeding joy. This is truly

stupendous! When we think of how we were dead through our trespasses and sins; poor, weak, failing servants, and then to think that one day we will stand absolutely faultless in the Throne Room of the Universe, rejoicing with exceeding joy, what grace is this!

Verse 25. He is not only our Keeper and Perfecter, He is God the Savior. It is a marvel that God should be so interested in us that He would also become our Savior, in the sense that He devised the plan whereby we are saved and He provided His sinless Son as the sacrificial Lamb. Who alone is wise (ultimately all wisdom comes from God James 1:5). Our wisdom is derived from the Fount of Wisdom the only wise God.

If worship (Old English "worthship") means ascribing to God majesty, dominion, and power; Glory the superlative honor He desires for all He is and all He has done for us. Majesty, the dignity and splendor He deserves as the Supreme Monarch of the universe. Dominion the unchallenged sway that is His by sovereign right. And power or authority—the might and prerogative to rule all that His hands have made.

He was worthy of such praise in the past. He is worthy at the present time and He will be worthy of it throughout eternity. Apostates and false teachers may seek to rob Him of glory, detract from His majesty, grumble against His dominion, and challenge His power. SOUTH KOREA

Recently Dr. Kwang Suk Shin, who served as the Director for JGHM: South Korean Branch, reminded me of how he became involved in the prayer seminar in 1988. He and several Korean pastors came by boat from South Korea to Japan to attend a Luther Rice Seminary course on prayer that I was teaching in Tokyo. I taught in English and Dr. Watanabi interpreted into Japanese. The South Korean pastors were gathered in the back of the conference room and there was an interpreter interpreting the Japanese into Korean. It was obvious that the Holy Spirit was the Teacher.

Dr. Shin invited Sue and me to return to South Korea and told us he would be responsible to coordinate. The power of God began to work, lives changed, and churches revived. A mighty prayer movement was launched and blossomed.

The following is from an article that appeared in the Reflector (Vol 34, No. 6 July-August 1988) following the Korean Seminars. "Leaders from over forty churches located in twenty-seven cities attended the Korean seminars conducted in Taegu and Masan. According to Southern Baptist missionary O. B. Humphries, most of South Korea was represented with the exception of the northeastern section. Participants were from various denominations such as Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian, and Assemblies of God."

There was strong interest expressed by a number of pastors and leaders for prayer seminars in their localities. There was a



Korean translation of the prayer seminar workbook. A highlight of the visit was addressing the thirty graduates of the Korean-American Theological Seminary, a joint venture of J. Gordon Henry Ministries and pastors in the Masan area. As the American president of this institution, it was my thrilling privilege to sign the certificates presented to the graduates. It was reported that a Doorkeeper program was established to support the work of Dr. Shin. At one point, there were sixty-nine Korean Doorkeepers. During that era, the Reflector wended its way to as many as 13,000 homes so many brothers and sisters provided prayer and financial support both at home and abroad.

Sue and I returned for our last visit to South Korea November 18-December 5, 2005. Over 4,000 attended the prayer seminars.

In my Book of Memories, I often stroll down Reminiscent Trail to recall work with the Mennonites, primarily in New York and Pennsylvania. One highlight was a weekend with their pastors/leaders at their beautiful meeting facility in Upstate New York. It was during these days that JGHM began to partner with the Mennonite Board of Missions Media Ministries in Harrisonburg, Virginia to produce an annual desk calendar that we shared with the **Doorkeepers**. A theme was chosen, along with appropriate Scriptures and pictures for each month. After many years, this service was discontinued due to the high cost of production. I have kept the calendars and pull them out to use in years with corresponding dates.

In 1988, the theme was **Strength for Every Day**. Here are the thoughts and Scriptures for each month:

JANUARY, When you need some STRENGTH FOR TOUGH TIMES.

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you (Isaiah 43:2).

FEBRUARY. When you need some COMFORT.

God is our refuge and strength, an ever present help in time of trouble (Psalm 46:1).

MARCH. When you need some RENEWED HOPE.

I wait for the Lord, and in God's Word I put my hope (Psalm 103:5).

APRIL. When you want some RENEWED PATIENCE.

Patience produces character and character hope (Psalm 5:3 Paraphrase).

MAY. When you want FREEDOM IN CHRIST.

So if Jesus sets you free, you will be free indeed (John 8:36).

JUNE. When you want TO REACH OUT.

As we have opportunity, let us do good to all people (Galatians 6:10).

JULY. When you want TO TAKE TIME FOR FAMILY.

And He took the children in His arms and blessed them (Mark 10:16).

AUGUST. When you want ASSURANCE OF GOD'S PROVIDENCE,

From everlasting to everlasting You are God (Psalm 90:2b).

SEPTEMBER. When you want TO SHARE GOD'S LOVE.

Look not only to your own, but also to the interests of others (Philippians 2:4).

OCTOBER. When you want TO CHOOSE PRIORITIES.

Seek first God's kingdom and righteousness (Matthew 6:33).

NOVEMBER. When you want TO ASK FORGIVENESS.

First go and be reconciled, then come and offer your gift (Matthew 5:24).

DECEMBER. When you want TO CELEBRATE.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace (Luke 2:14).

Where do we get strength of **every** day, no matter what the day holds? The obvious answer is God and His Word; like an ancient hymn says, "God hath not promised skies always blue; flower strewn pathways all our lives through; God hath not promised sun without rain, joy without sorrow, peace without pain. 
Many years ago, a poem was written by **Ida** A. Guirey and published in the Sunday School Times that encapsulates the extent of praise:
