The Liberty Years 1972-1978

Seldom in a lifetime does one see a grand vision become a reality. The vision for a biblically-based Christian college was in the minds of **Dr. Jerry Falwell** and **Dr. Elmer Towns** when my family and I arrived in Lynchburg, Virginia in May 1972 to join the LBC team. The next six years were demanding, but productive ones. There were many challenges and obstacles, but **there was never an identity crisis**. We knew who we were and where we were going. As we forged ahead clarifying the purpose and objectives statement, developing educational programs with appropriate policies and procedures to guide their implementation, recruiting students, and raising resources, God became Jehovah-Jireh (the Lord who provides and sees to it) in the fullest sense of His name.

A Council on Academic Affairs was established to work with me in overseeing the venture in which we were engaged. A paper trail was established for their work and the work of all other committees, as well as faculty meetings with full concept minutes. My primary instrument for communication within the college community was known as **The Academic Dean's Memo** reducing to writing not only major events, but day-to-day work. There were several red-letter days. One was when we were awarded state approval to grant degrees. Another was when we were awarded candidacy recognition with the

Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) achieved in a record-breaking time. It was a great day when our teacher education graduates were certified to teach in Virginia.

During an evaluation team visit from the **Transnational Association of Christian Schools and Colleges (TRACS) on Friday, March 2, 1990**, I presented my personal copies of key documents (such as a full set of **The Academic Dean's Memo**) to Dr. Falwell for the archives. On Monday, June 15, I returned to campus to present additional archival items including a framed copy of the purpose and objectives statement that guided us in the foundational years, a copy of my final commencement bulletin with a personal thank-you note to Sue and me from Dr. Falwell in his handwriting, a set of my annual academic dean's addresses to the faculty, and a portrait commissioned by my friend and colleague, **Dr. Ron Cottle**, Columbus, Georgia.

The vision has been realized; the dream has come true. The torch has been passed. Now I have one more request for our **Doorkeepers**. As never before, Liberty University and its key leaders, Chancellor **Jerry Falwell Jr.** and Provost/Vice President for Academic Affairs **Boyd Rist** need your prayers. Of course, Satan does not like the idea of a sound Christian educational institution. We can provide a prayer covering for Liberty.

Perspectives

Most Christians put prayer high on their list of failures and deficiencies. What about your personal altar? Is it broken down and deserted? Take measure of your prayer life. What has happened to the practice of prayer in your life?

No believer's spiritual life will ever rise above the level of his praying. You are what you are on your knees nothing more. Regular daily contact with your Source of spiritual life, Jesus Christ Himself, is absolutely necessary.

Average Christians fail in their prayer lives because they do not set apart a definite time and place to meet the Lord daily. Would you expect to be healthy if you ate a meal only once a week? Of course not! The same is true in your spiritual life.

During the past few months, I have been sharing thoughts from three morning lectures delivered by **Matthew Henry** in 1712, two years before his death. In this study, I want to conclude thoughts from the first message dealing with **how to begin the day with God**. The bulk of this study is from an article that I wrote for the Pathway *Witness* Magazine (November 1983)

Here's a workable plan on how to begin and maintain a morning meeting with the Lord. Sink your roots deeply into a **DAILY DEVOTIONAL LIFE**. Without a **QUIET TIME**, you will not grow spiritually as you should.

Here are some suggestions for starting your daily time with God.

ESTABLISH IN YOUR MIND THE PRIORITY OF PRAYER

You do what you consider important. You have spent a lifetime developing patterns of behavior that have become habits in your life. In order to establish a prayer time, you may need to develop new habits. As you are in the process of doing this, you will be pulled between old habits and the new ones; that's normal, so expect it. Make up your mind that **each day** you will find a time to be alone with Christ. Set a specific time to meet Him in prayer.

DESIGNATE A TIME AND A PLACE

Begin each day with God. If you normally get up at 6 a.m., plan to get up at 5:45 a.m. to have a few minutes with God. **THIS IS A MATTER OF DISCIPLINE**. If we follow the example of Jesus, it will be a morning hour. You may need to get to bed earlier so you can meet your appointment with God.

Jesus gave His disciples a model prayer, revealing a pattern for us to follow. That prayer assumes early morning praying. You would not ask God for your daily bread, for example, after your day is over. Neither would you need deliverance from temptation when you are about to go to sleep.

A major reason why it should be the first part of your days is that we should invite God in on the beginning; we should not wait until we have messed up our day and then go to God to put the pieces back together.

The place of prayer should be private. Jesus suggested a place that is quiet, secluded, and shut when He talked about closet praying. In His day, folks kept their valuables in closets; hence, there was limited access to the closet. It is obvious that we need to designate a place to be our altar of prayer that is as free from interruptions as possible. Use that place exclusively for your time with God.

Remember, you must in your mind and heart make prayer a priority enough to schedule a time for prayer in your daily life just as you schedule eating and sleeping. You can do it! Ask God to help you: "Lord, I look forward to meeting You the first thing in the morning for a few minutes. When I awaken, I will keep my appointment with You."

"IN THE MORNING"

Since I had learned the importance of early morning praying, I welcomed Matthew Henry's perspective related to "in the morning," David's expression: "For to You I will pray. My voice You shall hear in the morning, O Lord; in the morning I will direct it to You, and I will look up" (**Psalm 5:3 KJV**). Another translation is "In the morning, I lay my requests before You and wait in expectation." Henry pointed out that this language denotes a close application of mind

and heart, an earnest and elevated purpose in the supplicant. Not to others, nor to be heard by them, do we pray, but to God. We “look up” to Him as dwelling in the heavens, yet as One whom the heaven of heavens cannot contain. We must also “look up: for an answer to our prayers, and we must look around us to observe how far God operates in our favor and what obstacles are to be removed before a gracious answer may be reasonably expected.

The time appropriated to prayer is in the morning, not then only, but prayer is to be one of the first employments in the day. Every Christian should commence the day with secret prayer for several reasons:

1. The morning being the first part of the day, it is fit that He who is the First, should have the first, and be first served.
2. In the morning we are in the best condition, both of body and mind, for the proper service of God, and He is obviously entitled to the best service it is in our power to render.
3. In the morning it is most fitting to acknowledge the great mercies of the night just passed, the protection of life and health, the invigoration of the body and the mind for duties and enjoyments. Have we had a good night? Let us repair to the throne of grace with our cheerful thanksgiving. How many are the mercies involved in passing a good night and beginning a new day.
4. In the morning it is fitting to look to God, with humble supplications, for cleansing to begin the new day aright.
5. Before beginning the work of the day, we need to ask counsel, direction, assistance, and success from God, whose providence may so greatly help us, and without whose blessing we have no reason to look for success. We know not what the day may bring forth. We beseech His grace to furnish us thoroughly for every good word and work. In like manner, we need to ask that during the day we may not think, or speak, or do anything contrary to His grace.”

HOW TO USE THE DAILY TIME

Have a Bible and pencil handy. Begin by reading His Word listening to Him. As you put the proper information into your mind, you program your day to let Christ be Lord in your life.

Let God speak to you directly through His Word. Read a brief portion and think about what you are reading. Open your heart to God, offering Him the right to teach, to discipline, and to direct you as you study.

You will be surprised at what He is ready to do for you.

HOW TO SPEND THE DAY WITH GOD

Henry’s second lecture was how to spend the day with God. Using David’s expression, “On Thee do I wait all the day” (**Psalms 25:5**), he dealt with how to keep our hope in Him all day long. We will cover that in the August **Reflector**.

If you have never experienced being with God in the early morning, I encourage you to try it one time. You will then see the difference this makes throughout your day.

A Sunday in the Blue Ridge

Sunday, August 31, 1986. I remember it as though it were yesterday. I had traveled from our home in Murfreesboro, Tennessee to Central Virginia to conduct a prayer seminar in **Dr. Tom Foster's** home church in the Blue Ridge Mountains in Nelson County at the Rockfish Valley Baptist Church, Nellysford. He and his wife, **Mary Dale**, had become precious friends during my days at Liberty Baptist College (now Liberty University). He held a professorship in business at a university in Oklahoma and had expressed interest in coming to Liberty to begin our business program. Although he did not come, we kept in close touch. The Fosters spent the summers in his childhood home in Nelson County.

The excitement was enhanced by having our daughter **Melody**, a nurse in Lynchburg, to spend the day with me as I shared the seminar. I never dreamed that the time spent there would impact my life so dramatically. Dr. Foster's sister, **Catherine Thomas**, decided to become a **Doorkeeper** that day. For years upon years, she was a faithful partner. Now all three **Dr. Foster**, **Mary Dale**, and **Catherine** are residents of the Celestial City called Heaven.

That was the day that **Josephine Fitzgerald** came into my life. She, too, became a **Doorkeeper** that day. Without question, the impact that she had on the prayer seminar ministry and my life was unequalled by any other. We became "one" from day one! She was seventy-seven.

To begin with, Josephine informed me that God wanted her to write a book. When I said, "Well, then you must write a book." She said, "I can't write a book." But she did. In fact, she wrote five books. Her first book, published in 1990, was entitled **When Thou Passest Through the Waters**. Her other four books are **Precious Memories** (1994), **I Found the Answer . . . I Prayed** (1996), **We Grow in the Valleys** (1998), and **Christ Our Burden Bearer** (2001). She initially wrote in longhand, but someone gave her a typewriter and she learned to type. Many of our long-term

For years, every few weeks, I had a letter from Josephine, written in her home in the Blue Ridge. She always had a Scripture to share not just the reference, but she wrote out the verse completely. I cherished and was strengthened by her friendship. I knew that she not only prayed for me every morning, but many times during the day. She was our oldest **Doorkeeper**.

Josephine told her family that she was going to live to be a hundred and then she was going to be with the Lord. To celebrate her 100th birthday on January 13, family and friends gathered at her home in Alabama (where she had moved to live with her daughter and granddaughter). Two days later, Josephine laid down on her bed to sleep and woke up in Heaven. I'm not surprised that this is what happened. Certainly, we will miss Josephine on earth. For many years, she had longed for God to take her. On one occasion, she was seriously ill in the University of Virginia Medical Center, actually thought to be at the point of death. However, God raised her up because He wanted her to write another book. The first letter after she returned home began with the words "I'm so disappointed. I thought I was going to Heaven, but here I am back in my earthly home." She always wanted her **Doorkeeper** family to have a copy of each book; many of you have all five.

"Well done, good and faithful servant . . . enter into the joys of the Lord." In Josephine's memory, I want to share an article from one of her books. Actually, this selection is illustrative of the lessons Josephine taught in each anecdote used in her writings. Enjoy. Remember. Be challenged!

A DIFFERENT LOOK AT THE LORD'S PRAYER

"Our Father which are in heaven ..."
Yes?

Don't interrupt me. I'm praying. **But you called Me.** Called You? I didn't call You. I'm praying.

"Our Father which are in heaven..." **There you did it again.**

Did what? **Called Me. You said, 'Our Father which are in heaven.' Here I am. What's on your mind?**

But I didn't mean anything by it. I was, you know, just saying my prayers for the day. I always say the Lord's Prayer. It makes me feel good, kind of like getting a duty done. **All right. Go on.**

"Hallowed be Thy name ..."
Hold it. What do you mean by that?

By what? **By 'hallowed be thy name?'**
It means ... it means... Good grief! I don't know what it means. How should I know? It's just a part of the prayer. By the way, what does it mean? **It means honored, holy, wonderful.**

Hey, that makes sense. I never thought about what 'hallowed' meant before.

"Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."
Do you really mean that?

Sure, why not? **What are you doing about it?**

Doing? Nothing, I guess. I just think it would be kind of neat if you got control of everything down here like you have up there. **Have I got control of you?**

Well, I go to church. **That isn't what I asked you. What about your bad temper? You've really got a problem there, you know. And then there's the way you spend your money, all on yourself. And what about the kind of books you read?**

Stop picking on me! I'm just as good as some of the rest of those people at the church. **Excuse Me. I thought you were praying for My will to be done. If that is to happen, it will have to start with the ones who are praying for it. Like you, for example.**

Oh, all right. I guess I do have some hang ups. Now that you mention it, I could probably name some others. **So could I.** I haven't thought about it very much until now, but I really would like to cut out some of those things. I would like to, you know, be really free. **Good. Now we're getting somewhere. We'll work together, you and I. Some victories can truly be won. I'm proud of you.**

Look, Lord, I need to finish up here. This is taking a lot longer than it usually does.

"Give us this day, our daily bread."
You need to cut your bread. You're overweight as it is.

Hey, wait a minute! What is this, 'Criticize me day?' Here I was doing my religious duty, and all of a sudden you break in and remind me of all my hang-ups. **Praying is a dangerous thing. You could wind up changed, you know. That's what I'm trying to get across to you. You called me, and here I am. It's too late to stop now. Keep praying. I'm interested in the next part of your prayer ... Well, go on.**

I'm scared to go on. **Scared? Of what?**
I know what you'll say. **Try me and see.**

"Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us."
What about Ann?

See? I knew it! I knew you would bring her up! Why Lord, she's told lies about me, spread stories about my family. She never paid back the debt she owes me. I've sworn

to get even with her! ***But your prayer? What about your prayer?***

I didn't mean it. ***Well, at least you're honest. But it's not much fun carrying that load of bitterness around inside, is it?***

No, but I'll get better as soon as I get even. Boy, have I got some plans for that neighbor. She'll wish she had never moved into this neighborhood. ***You won't feel any better. You'll feel worse. Revenge isn't sweet. Think of how unhappy you already are. But I can change all that.***

You can? How? ***Forgive Ann. Then I'll forgive you. Then the hate and sin will be Ann's problem and not yours. You will have settled your heart.***

Oh, You're right. You always are. And more than I want to revenge Ann, I want to be right with You. Ann, I want to be right with you ...(pause) ... (sigh). All right. All right. I forgive her. Help her to find the right road in life, Lord. She's bound to be awfully miserable now that I think about it. Anybody who goes around doing the things she does to others has to be out of it. Some way, some how, show her the right way. ***There now! Wonderful! How do you feel?***

Hmmmm. Well, not bad. Not bad at all. In fact, I feel pretty great! You know, I don't think I'll have to go to bed uptight tonight for the first time since I can remember. Maybe I won't be so tired from now on because I'm not getting enough rest. ***You're not through with your prayer. Go on.***

Oh, all right.

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." ***Good! Good! I'll do that. Just don't put yourself in a place where you can be tempted.***

What do You mean by that? ***Don't turn on the TV when you know the laundry needs to be done and the house needs to be picked up. Also, about the time you spend***

coffee-ing with your friends, if you can't influence the conversation to positive things, perhaps you should re-think the value of those friendships. Another thing, your neighbors and friends shouldn't be your standard for 'keeping up.' And please don't use Me for an escape hatch.

I don't understand the last part. ***Sure you do. You've done it a lot of times. You get caught in a bad situation. You get into trouble and then you coming running to Me, 'Lord, help me out of this mess, and I promise You I'll never do it again.' You remember some of those bargains you tried to make with Me?***

Yes, and I'm ashamed, Lord. I really am. ***Which bargain are you remembering?***

Well, there was the night that Bill was gone and the children and I were home alone. The wind was blowing so hard I thought the roof would go any minute and tornado warnings were out. I remember praying, 'Oh God, if you spare us, I'll never skip my devotions again.' ***I protected you, but you didn't keep your promise, did you?***

I'm sorry, Lord, I really am. Up until now I thought that if I just prayed the Lord's Prayer every day, then I could do what I liked. I didn't expect anything to happen like it is. ***Go ahead and finish your prayer.***

Prayer as work

John Wesley: "God works only in concert with the praying of His people." **Charles Spurgeon**: "The rule of the Kingdom is asking, and God did not change it even for His Son when He was on earth." The Sovereign God has ordained prayer as the primary tool to get His work done on earth. Prayer looks toward earth, people and circumstances, and that is WORK. Prayer is never a prefix (that which comes before) or a suffix (that which comes after), but is the way God has provided to enable us to work "with" Him, not just "for" Him!
