



Under the Shadow of the Cross

My "spiritual metamorphosis" began in 1977 when I began to read the Bible for my spiritual food, rather than for a message to preach. Many exciting moments came my way as I discovered the Holy Spirit was an active Helper in opening up my understanding seeing things in a different perspective. He taught me the value of tarrying at key chapters of the Bible such as Psalm 37, Romans 8, and 2 Corinthians 5 rather than rushing through them as I had done previously.

The verbs (action words), along with the promises, stirred my interest as I mulled over Psalm 37. Between the beginning of Romans 8 (no condemnation to those in Christ Jesus) and the ending (no separation from the love of God) are special insights into the role of both Jesus and the Holy Spirit in praying. The companion Psalms, 51 and 32, highlighted the blessedness of forgiveness and how to arrive at that point. There is a section of Scripture, John 13-17, commonly called "The Upper Room Discourse" that impacted my ife and ministry even until this day.

I am not sure that I possess the vocabulary to express aspects of the metamorphosis that changed my life, my ministry, and my career. I can only say, "Thank You, my Father, My Savior, and my Helper, the Holy Spirit.



A PASSAGE EVERY BELIEVER SHOULD MASTER: JOHN 13, 14, 15, 16, 17

This key passage contains the last words of Jesus before He left the earth—final words of instruction to the disciples, a farewell message. You can imagine how important these words are.

I. Holy Spirit (see pages 13 & 20).

II. Prayer. Sevenfold invitation to pray "In My Name" / "In His name (see page 14-15). Here's homework:

Look up the references and write out the invitations to pray in your own words

- 1. JOHN 14:13 Jesus promises to do what we ask in His name.
- 2. JOHN 14:14
- 3. JOHN 15:6 .8
- 4. JOHN 15:14 A true friend will obey His commands in all things.
- 5. JOHN 15:16
- 6. JOHN 16: 23-24
- 7. JOHN 16:26

After teaching this section for a few years, a participant in a prayer seminar asked if I had written a book about this key passage. When I answered "no," she said, "Since you believe this passage needs to be mastered, you should definitely write the book." A few years later, The Upper Room Discourse became available on the book table. Of the books that I have written, this book remains my favorite.

Much of what I teach about the the Word and Prayer, with attention given to the role both Jesus and the **Holy Spirit** play, is anchored in content from the Upper Room Discourse. The ministry of the Lord Jesus was full of truth and teaching His disciples at that time and for us today. Our Lord's earthly public ministry closed at the end of John 12. The Lord will no more walk the roads of Judea teaching, preaching and healing. In John 13 to 17, we have His private ministry to His own. This is an intimate ministry to His own before He leaves them and goes to the Cross. But His ministry during His days and hours before He went to the cross carries with it certain truths that would help to equip His followers after He was gone. He will teach them things they need To know. He will comfort their hearts. He will predict things to come in these chapters. In this portion, He tells them of the ministry of the Spirit who will meet their needs and who will serve them in His in His absence. These chapters, spoken UNDER THE SHADOW OF THE CROSS carry in them tremendous truths for the people of God.

What the Names of Christ Tell Us About God

In an encounter with Moses, God revealed His name that was to be known "forever"—the name "by which I am to be remembered from generation to generation" (Exodus 3:15). The name was "I AM." Today, we know the name as <u>Jehovah</u> or <u>Yahweh</u>. Most English translations have <u>LORD</u> (all caps) where the Hebrew has 'I AM.' In the May issue of the Reflector (pp 4-5), a Program of Praise to the LORD organized by Bob Hostetler, was presented. Hopefully, you were able to give this a try all thirty-one days of May. By slight modification, you could review and repeat the Scripture-base Scriptures in your Quiet Time day-by-day in June and other months. By using this approach, your praise and worship (the element of "adoration") can revitalize or strengthen your prayer time. Actually, <u>your praise and worship will not change God (His essence, His character, or His attributes) at all. He will never be any greater than He already is. This exercise will change you and prepare you for what lies ahead.</u>

In reviewing the years in teaching the six-hour prayer seminar around the world, some of the sweetest moments in a seminar are when we discuss "adoration" providing some practical suggestions to use in so doing. In the thirty-page Prayer Seminar Workbook, I refer to two pages, seven and twenty-five. Some have a copy of the original seventy-nine pages Prayer Seminar Workbook (79 pages) and the key pages are seven, fifty, and fifty-one although there is other information scattered throughout the seminar from other pages in the workbook.


In this issue, my focus will on praising the Son. The basic purpose of man is to "honor God and glorify Him forever" (Isaiah 43:7). The chief occupation of Heaven is to praise the Lord (review Revelation 5:11-14; 7:9-12; Psalms 113m 115, 145-150). Note Revelation 5:13: "Blessing, honor, and glory, and power be unto Him who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb, forever and ever."

The names of Jesus tell us about God's character. We began our focus by looking at four of His most often-used names. Jesus. This name was given to Jesus by angelic pronouncement before His birth (Matthew 1:21); Luke 1:31). It is the Greek form of the Hebrew name Joshua and it means "the Lord is salvation." The name is a reminder that God delights in the salvation of His people. He delivered them in the past (the exodus and the return from Babylon). He is delivering people spiritually in the present, and He will deliver Israel literally in the end-times through Jesus.

Christ. This name is the Greek equivalent of the Hebrew word Messiah,, which means "the anointed One." Because this term was politically charged, Jesus used it of Himself sparingly. The name underscores the reliability of God; He had promised a deliverer and now He had come "to save His people from their sins."

Son of Man. This was the term Jesus used most often of Himself. It was used prophetically of Jesus in Daniel 7:13-14. Jesus used this name to identify with mankind in general (Psalm 8:4; 80:17). This name tells us that God was willing to identify with His people and become their substitute to bring them salvation.

Son of God. Jesus did not use this term for Himself very often. It was given to Him by the Father at His baptism and transfiguration (Matthew 3:17; Luke 9:35). It identified Christ as God's Son—equal with the Father and having power to do things only God can do (see John 5:25-26). The name reminds us that He truly was God among men.



Name above all names ... JESUS!

In <u>GENESIS</u>, Jesus is the Ram at Abraham's altar. In <u>Exodus</u> He's the Passover Lamb. In <u>LEVITICUS</u> He's the High Priest. In <u>NUMBERS</u> He's the Cloud by night and the pillar of fire by night. In <u>DEUTERONOM</u>Y He's the City of Refuge.

IN <u>JOSHUA</u> He's the Scarlet Thread out Rahab's window. In <u>JUDGES</u> He is our Judge. In <u>RUTH</u> He is our Kinsman Redeemer. In 1^{SI} & 2ND <u>SAMUEL</u> He's our Trusted Prophet. In <u>KINGS</u> and <u>CHRONICLES</u> HE'S OUR Reigning King. In <u>EZRA</u> He is our Faithful Scribe. In <u>NEHEMIAH</u> He's the Rebuilder of everything that is broken. And in <u>ESTHER</u> He is Mordecai sitting faithful at the gate.

In <u>JOB</u> He's our Redeemer that ever lives. In <u>PSALMS</u> He is my Shepherd and I shall not want. In <u>PROVERBS</u> and <u>ECCLESIASTES</u> He is our Wisdom. In the <u>SONG OF SOLOMON</u> He is the Beautiful Bridegroom.

In <u>ISAIAH</u> He's the Suffering Servant. In <u>JEREMIAH</u> and <u>LAMENTATIONS</u> it is Jesus that is the Weeping Prophet. In <u>EZEKIE</u>L He's the Wonderful Four-Faced man. And in <u>DANIEL</u> He is the Fourth Man in the midst of a fiery furnace. In <u>HOSEA</u> He is my love that is forever faithful. In <u>JOEL</u> He baptizes us with the Holy Spirit. In <u>AMOS</u> He Is our Burden Bearer. In <u>OBADIAH</u> our Savior. And in <u>JONAH</u> He is the Great Foreign Missionary that takes the Word of God into all the world. You go on and see in <u>MICAH</u> He is the Messenger with beautiful feet. In <u>NAHUM</u> He is the Avenger, In <u>HABAKKUK</u> He is the Watchman that is ever praying for revival. In <u>ZEPHANIAH</u> He is the Lord mighty to save In <u>HAGGAI</u> He is the Restorer of our lost heritage. In <u>ZECHARIAH</u> He is our Fountain. And in MALACHI He is the Son of Righteousness with healing in His wings.

In <u>MATTHEW</u> He is the Christ, the Son of the Living God. In <u>MARK</u> He is the Miracle Worker. In <u>LUKE</u> He is the Son of Man. In <u>JOHN</u> He is the Door by which everyone must enter. In <u>ACTS</u> He is the Shining Light that appears to Saul on the road to Damascus.

In <u>ROMANS</u> He is our Justifier. In <u>1st</u> <u>CORINTHIANS</u> He us our Resurrection. In <u>2nd</u> <u>CORINTHIANS</u> He is our Sin Bearer. In <u>GALATIONS</u> He redeems us from the Law. In <u>EPHESIANS</u> He's our Unsearchable Riches. In <u>PHILLIPIANS</u> He supplies our every need, And in <u>COLOSSIANS</u> He's

the Fullness of the Godhead Boldly. In <u>1st and 2nd THESSALONIANS</u> He is our Soon Coming King. In 1^{st} and 2^{nd} TIMOTHY He is the Mediator between God and man. In <u>TITUS</u> He is our Blessed Hope. In PHILEMON He is a Friend that sticks closer than a brother. And in <u>HEBREWS</u> He's the Blood of the everlasting covenant.

In <u>JAMES</u> He is the Lord that heals the sick. In 1^{st} and 2^{nd} PETER He is the Chief Shepherd. In 1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} JOHN He is Jesus who has the tenderness of love. In <u>JUDE</u> He is the Lord coming with 10,000 saints. And in <u>REVELATION</u>, lift up your eyes, Church, for your redemption draws near; He is the King of kings and Lord of lords.

No other name but the name of Jesus, no other name but the name of the Lord. No other name but the name of Jesus is worthy of glory ...of honor ...of power ..of all praise. Hallelujah! Praise the Lamb who was slain!


I looked out my window

A Relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ

What a privilege for us to have a relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ—the eternal Son of God who is now seated at the right hand of the Father in Heaven's Throne Room making intercession for us. The relationship, however, must be on His terms and not ours. Some profess this relationship but know little what Christ taught, less of what He promised, and even less of what He requires for a relationship to be established. This is unlikely to change until a person understands that God speaks through His Word and is willing to get into the Word for himself. Very frankly, if we want God to speak to us we must humble ourselves and personalize the Word to the extent that we once again "tremble at His Word" (Isaiah 66:2b).

BIBLE. The Bible is the only place where you will find direct information on what God's terms for relationship are. Actually you and I can hear His voice as we read and assimilate His Word. Therefore, we need to approach Bible reading with reverent anticipation that God will speak through the wonderful Words He has written. PRAY. I have found it helpful to begin with a brief prayer asking for the Holy Spirit, who inspired the very words I will read, to interpret it to my own understanding. The primary Scripture I use to prepare my heart and mind for a meaningful time in the Word has always been, "Open my eyes that I may see wondrous things from Your Word" (Psalm 119:18. ACT ON THE WORD. As soon as you understand a Scripture, put it into

practice. You qill then be equipped for the tasks God gives you in your daily circumstances.

A KEY PASSAGE 2 Timothy 3:15-17

HEAR. READ. STUDY. MEMORIZE. MEDITATE. APPLY THE WORD OF GOD. Note the "how" of the equipping in verse 15: 1. Through teaching. Tells you what to do. 2. Through reproof. Tells you what not to do. 3. Through correction. Tells you what to do when you have done what you were told not to do. Note that this covers just about everything! So stir yourself to get the Word of God into your mind as a priority to developing a strong relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ

The Bible is our New Prayer Language

Armin Gesswein (1907-2001)

Jesus said: Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God (Matthew 4:4).

We hear people say we are given a new prayer language when God fills us with His Holy Spirit.

Yes, indeed! Jesus perfectly demonstrates this. After He was anointed and filled with the Holy Spirit at John the Baptist's Jordan River camp meeting, the Spirit led (even drove) Him into the wilderness to be tempted and tested by the devil. The battle supreme was joined calling for His most intense praying. There He fasted and prayed through His whole Life-plan and Messianic ministry.

This called for the <u>highest kind of</u>
<u>Prayer Language</u>. And what was that?
<u>HOLY SCRIPTURE</u>, THE WORD OF
GOD.

Let me say it reverently: even Jesus did not DIRECTLY combat Satan in prayer, though He was filled with the Spirit beyond measure. What a lesson! Three times He broad-sworded the devil with IT IS WRITTEN... IT IS WRITTEN... IT IS WRITTEN... He was as full of Scripture as He was of the Spirit, so full of Scripture that He did not even need a concordance!

JESUS' PRAYING MODELS AND MENTORS GENUINE SPIRIT-FILLED CHRISTIAN PRAYING. His messianic ministry begins in prayer with the above verse, which He uses against the master of iniquity, Satan Himself. His mighty ministry began in prayer and continued that way. In His prayer-life and ministry, He prayed through and brought forth all of His ministry. HE PRAYED EVERYTHING INTO BEING. He did just pray about things

(like most Christians do), He <u>brought</u> things about by prayer.

This was Jesus' greatest secret. And it must become our greatest secret. If this is to happen, we must also learn to live (not only by the Word of God, but) by EVERY WORD (Luke 4:4). We must fill up on Scripture, and be as full of Scripture as (we say we are) full of the Holy Spirit. If we say we are full of the Holy Spirit, and are weak in the Word of God, we will be weak in prayer. We will be weak in faith, and will never get great answers, the kind that changes our lives, and others through us.

The praying of Jesus also demonstrates how high the Word of God stands in the counsels of eternity. I feel very sorry for those who have weak views of the Inspiration of Holy Scripture. They have no sword for spiritual combat.

Jesus said EVERY WORD is inspired. Armin Gesswein, my mentor in the prayer seminar ministry, said that he and Billy Graham were riding in a taxi in Buffalo, New York. Armin said, I believe in verbal inspiration of the Bible ... even I weigh every word carefully when I write. If God did not inspire words I don't know what He did inspire. Billy Graham agreed and based His messages on this truth. God honored His Word delivered through His servant.

The Word of God is known at the throne! It is (so to speak) wired to the throne! THRONE WORDS! HOW WONDERFUL! The Bible is GOD'S LANGUAGE, and we must learn it! There is no language like it on earth. It is made for prayer and for all our living. Though it has so many uses, Jesus here demonstrates that its first and primary use is in prayer. THE MORE WE LEARN OUR NEW PRAYER LANGUAGE (SCRIPTURE), THE MORE EVERYTHING ELSE COMES INTO NEW LIFE!

Do you want a blessing? Sing to the tune "He is Lord." Personalize the words to sing to Him and not about Him.

"You are Lord. You are Lord, You have risen from the dead and You are Lord. Yes, my knee has bowed and my tongue has confessed,

Jesus Christ, You're MY Lord."

During my travels to conduct prayer seminars, many of my students have shared articles, poems, music that they have written. As the Holy Spirit has led, I used many in our publications and then filed those not used. Recently, I was impressed with two sheets in that file, no date and no name, written following a prayer seminar. The message conveyed is worth presenting and preserving. Hopefully, you will be able to personalize the thoughts expressed.

THE FIRST SHEET. If you love Me and are obedient. I will come in. Do I? Am I? Is Christ Jesus the Lord of my life? It is time for me to seriously and objectively examine myself through the eyes of Scripture. Begin by asking God to show you any sin in your life. When He does, make a sin list so you will not forget even one sin He reveals. Since the book of Matthew is the first book in the New Testament and records many of the words of Jesus, I have chosen some passages to get started on my examination from Matthew. Matthew 5:22. Am I presently angry with anyone? 5:28. How is my thought life? 5:44. Do I have any hatred of those who persecute me? 6:1-5. Does my life shine for Christ? 6:24. What are the priorities of my life? 12:36. Do I have idle words of criticism about others? 15:18-24. Do I have evil thoughts, hatred, or lust?

Are there sins that are not covered in these passages from Matthew that need to go on my list? If so, I will add them to my sin list.

Then I turn to 1 John 1:9 and read it to myself prayerfully at least five times. Now I draw an imaginary circle with only God and me inside ready for a conversation. "I am so deeply convicted. I agree with You, Lord, that these sins are in my life. I now repent, confess each specific sin, receive Your forgiveness and cleansing. I now go forth with a new freedom. You are Lord! I want You to be the Lord of my life!"

THE SECOND SHEET. JESUS CHRIST IS LORD OF MY LIFE WHEN

- 1. I obey the initial promptings of the Spirit without hesitation or arguing.
- 2. I am committed to fulfilling His will for my life without knowing the requirements.
- 3. I am available to serve Him regardless of the time, the place, or the circumstances.
- 4. My desire to please Him exceeds my desire to please others.
- 5. I recognize and submit to His ownership of my total life and all my possessions.
- I am turning my difficulties and my failures into experiences of spiritual growth
- 7. I recognize Him as the Source of all my needs and desires
- 8. To know Him intimately becomes the obsession of my life.

Robert Gee Witty, Ph.D. (October 6,1906-June 20,2007)

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (BP) Robert Gee Witty, a pioneer in the development of non-residential theological education and doctor of ministry studies, died at the age of 100 on June 20, 2007 in a Jacksonville, Fla., hospice.

Witty, in 1962, was the founder of Luther Rice Seminary in Jacksonville, Fla., which relocated in 1991 to Lithonia, Ga., and is now Luther Rice University.

Witty, who was in the ministry 86 years according to family members, served as Luther Rice Seminary's president from 1968-82 and chancellor until 1987. At the time of the seminary's founding, Witty was pastor of Jacksonville's Central Baptist Church, which he led from 1943-70.

Over the years, Luther Rice has recorded an estimated 5,000 graduates. Currently, the university has 1,100 students (400 undergraduate, 700 graduate), 450 of whom are at the Atlanta-area campus.

He was born on Oct. 6, 1906, in Glasgow, Ky. Last year on Oct. 8, his church, Mandarin Baptist in Jacksonville, celebrated his 100th birthday with a special Sunday worship service.

R. Albert Mohler Jr., president of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Ky., and president of the SBC Council of Seminary Presidents, described Witty as a great Christian leader, a passionate Christian educator and one of the great innovative minds of his generation.

Mohler said Witty was a man ahead of his time.... His vision of taking educational programs to the people set the pattern for the radical expansion of educational opportunity in the United States. Long before the secular world had caught sight of this vision, Dr. Witty was already doing it.

He leaves a lasting impact on Baptist education and Baptist churches, Mohler said, but most importantly in the lives of so many he taught and served and led.

Tom Elliff, senior vice president of the SBC International Mission Board and a former SBC president, said Witty, known as Doc to friends and colleagues, though in his 90s, continued traveling, speaking, teaching, hosting a website and encouraging others in the faith.

Witty was the consummate soulwinner whose pockets brimmed with Gospel tracts. His stated goal in life was to leave each person with whom he came in contact 'with eternity in view.' Elliff said.

Mohler recounted the last time he visited with Witty: We had enjoyable lunch in a Jacksonville hotel and he had big plans for the afternoon, as I saw him off he drove away with a twinkle in his eye and a plan of action in his heart and he was 98 years old. Dr. Witty lived life to the fullest as a devoted follower of the Lord Jesus Christ. He will be greatly missed.

Witty was a visionary, said Roger Willmore, pastor of Deerfoot Baptist Church in Trussville, Ala., and president of the Alabama Baptist State Convention who, as a Luther Rice student in 1975, was befriended by Witty.

He enabled others to see more than they otherwise would see.

Witty's vision for Luther Rice Seminary provided a means of non-traditional theological education which was ahead of its time, Willmore said. Today, many seminaries, including SBC seminaries, use distance learning methods that were devised by Robert Witty. He played a significant role in creating the doctor of ministries degree. It was his desire to provide practical education and training for those who serve the church.

Willmore added that Witty had a shepherd's heart. He was gentle in his demeanor. He always had a special place in his heart for the smaller church pastor. Dr. Witty was one of the dearest friends I have ever had. For more than 30 years he poured his life into mine and many other pastors as well. He will be remembered for his passion for mentoring others and enabling them to be successful in their ministry.

In addition to serving as a pastor in Jacksonville, Witty also led churches in St. Petersburg and Davenport, Fla. He authored numerous books.

including Power for the Church, Help Yourself to Happiness, Signs of the Second Coming and Church Visitation, Theory and Practice. With Elliff, he coauthored In Their Own Words, a book of testimonies of men and women of faith.

In addition to earning a Ph.D. from the University of Florida and a doctor of theology degree from Burton Seminary in Vermont, family members said Witty also had earned degrees from Princeton Theological Seminary, Asbury Theological Seminary, Willamette University and Campbell School of Theology.

His wife Katherine died in 1994 after 55 years of marriage. Witty is survived by three sons, Robert Witty, Daniel Witty and Robert Hoover, and three daughters, Mary Love Spann, Ann Weisel and Edith Krblick; eight grandchildren, thirty-four greatgrandchildren and two great-great grandchildren.

Funeral services were at 11 a.m. Monday, June 25, at Mardarin Baptist Church in Jacksonville, with burial in Oaklawn Cemetery.

PRESIDENT'S PERSPECTIVE

Nothing means any more to me these days than leading prayer seminars. The prayer seminar is a six-hour event following the materials in a 69-page prayer seminar workbook. It is making a difference in the lives of many believers as is attested by the correspondence we receive. Individual believers are renewed and churches revived as the Holy Spirit brings the Word alive as it is taught and received.

Several months ago I led a prayer seminar on Staten Island. I received the letter quoted below from a journalist in that congregation. A few days ago he called to invite me to be the guest speaker for a week in August at Camp Spofford for the Eastern District of the Evangelical Free churches. In the course of conversation, he referred to his letter and stressed that he meant every word of it. Because my friend has shared the impact our Lord made on his life during our hours together, I share with our readers.

Dear Dr. Henry,

It has been more that two weeks now since you have been at my church for the prayer seminar. What a great two weeks it has been!

I have been a Christian for 18 years and the past two weeks have been the most exhilarating of my life. I am communicating with God like I never have before. Using your A-C-T-S as a guideline, I have been able to establish a daily morning prayer and Bible reading time. I begin with Bible reading and then finish in prayer. In 15 days, I have been able to have meaningful devotions 11 days. The days that, for one reason or another, I blew it, I really felt out of it.

I have discovered several interesting things:

The new-found time for prayer has increased my desire to read the Scriptures. The nourishment that I am pulling from the Bible reading, I am incorporating in my prayer time, especially in my adoration of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The Lord is beginning to burden me for the unsaved. I am the Adult Bible Class teacher and since your prayer seminar, I am praying for individuals in the class by name, and then, in some cases following up with a phone call.

The most exciting thing is that I sense the beginning of a revival at our church. I could be wrong because I have never been witness to a revival but things are happening that can only be of the Holy Spirit. I know for a fact that my wife and I are being transformed spiritually. And so many people in the church are on fire for the Lord. Our prayer meeting last Wednesday evening ran 25 minutes over. People were praying powerfully in the Spirit. Praying for loved ones. Confessing sins. Thanking God for who He is. Expecting great things. Praise God!

Anyway, I just wanted to share these things with you so you could enjoy our joy. Thanks for coming to our church. Thanks for making yourself available to God's call. Thanks for your positive message. (Even the fact that you mentioned that you appreciated the beautiful setting of the church impressed me and others. Most speakers come in and begin by putting down city life and extolling the virtues of the country. These speakers forget that many of us have chosen to remain in the city because we feel it is God's will.)

Once again, thanks and may the Lord bless you as you minister at Northeastern.

When the horizon is clear

When Dr. Warren Webster (1928-2007), president of the Conservative Baptist Foreign Missions, invited me to be the guest speaker for the annual retreat of their missionaries in Italy in October 1989, I was thrilled to accept. This was especially true since a long-standing date with the U. S. Air Force base had only recently been postponed due to a new chief chaplain's appointment. He told me that the venue for the week-long retreat was **Isola del Gran** Sasso D'Italia (Region Abruzzo, Province Teremo) which afforded a spectacular view of the highest peak of the mountain. We were able to accept an invitation to teach a prayer seminar at the Walzenhausen Bible School, in Walzenhausen, Switzerland on our way to Italy and prayer seminars in Merseyside and Liverpool, England.

Sue was able to join me for the Switzerland seminar, but had to fly back alone to Murfreesboro, Tennessee to resume her duties at the Middle Tennessee Medical Center. At the time of my arrival in Naples, Italy, the nation was reeling from a major earthquake that had done tremendous damage.

The missionary families were cordial and received my ministry quite readily. They, too, reiterated how beautiful the region was enhanced by the view of the **Gran Sasso**. At that time I was an avid jogger and was out jogging early every morning following my Quiet Time. Day one, I jogged but there was no mountain visible. This scenario was repeated a few days. Time after time, the missionaries shared that there was, indeed, a mountain hidden by the

cloud cover. As we came near the end of our time together, I went out one morning and there it was, just as had been depicted. What a memorable sight was the mountain when the clouds were lifted and the horizon cleared.

Doubt and discouragement can quickly and easily come when the horizon becomes hazy and unclear. That is for sure and we often are not prepared for such an encounter.

When I returned home to Murfreesboro, I shared tmy experience in the monthly Doorkeeper Report. I termed it a parable of our earthly sojourn and our spiritual lives. Sometimes we can see clearly while at other times a haze interferes. It is as though a haze has settled over the horizon, things not clear at all. What do we do when the fog arrives? In such times, **REMEMBER** that others experience the same. Job reminded us that man is born to trouble as do the sparks fly upward. This is a time for us to ask God for a full investigation of our spiritual lives.

Set aside more quality time to **READ THE BIBLE**. The psalmist said, when he came to wits end, troubled and distress, that God sent His Word and healed them (Psalm 107:20). The Bible has the answer! PRAY. It is not easy to pray because both your flesh and the devil don't want you to pray. There will be times when you won't feel like praying. Pray anyway! When it's hardest to pray. pray the hardest. Pray and believe! A faith lift is yours when you keep your eyes on Jesus. Then keep the faith! Learn to develop and cultivate situations that enable you to see clearly.

We need to purge ourselves of all that is evil and unworthy. Worship in spirit and truth. Be aware of beauty. It is at the hazy times that we need to explore the depths of prayer. We need to maintain a constant search for truth. We need to ponder the Scriptures We need to pray for faith and understanding. In the Sermon on the Mount, we read, Ask, and it will be given you; seek and you shall find; knock and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him that knocks it will be opened (Matthew 7:7-8). Literally, ask and keep on asking; seek and keep on seeking; knock and keep on knocking.


Then one day the horizon will clear. UPWARD AND ONWARD as you hear your Master's call, This is the way, walk you in it!


