A few months ago during my daily quiet time with God, I was thunderstruck by the passage in Exodus 3 where God was talking with Moses. "Take off your shoes, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." I think when Moses removed his shoes he was demonstrating his reverence and humility toward God. As I continued to read, I was overwhelmed by the awareness that where God dwells there is holy ground. And that burning bush Moses went to see was on fire, but it did not burn up. I felt as though God was speaking to me. As these exciting thoughts raced through my mind, adrenalin rushed through my blood stream. Since God's Holy Spirit dwells in the hearts of believers, I came to the conclusion that God was telling me, "Humble your heart, Paula, for the place where you are standing is holy ground."

We know that we, as believers, are commanded to be holy because God is holy. Questions flooded my mind. Am I "on fire" for the Lord? Does my testimony, my life, burn brightly for my Lord? Ever burning, still brighter, yet never burned up? As I continued, I thought, "I must re-think this concept of holy ground as a place where God, Himself, dwells."

As I stopped to refill my coffee cup, the gears in my mind continued to spin. I am one with Christ, crucified with Christ, positionally "in Christ," and He is "in me." Therefore, wherever I am, I am standing on holy ground! WOW! What a wonderful, glorious privilege, but what an enormous responsibility!

not diminished by the New Covenant of the believer's union with Christ. God does not change; He is still as awesome, as holy, as terrifying, as powerful, and as loving as He ever was. But now, He has revealed Himself in Christ Jesus. And so, as God the Father chose the virgin Mary's womb to place His Son, the Christ-child, so He has chosen you and me, as believers in Christ, to place His Holy Spirit. Literally, **GOD DWELLS IN US!** Now I have "known" this for years, but somehow the glorious impact of His truth had evaded me. It seems to me our God is telling us to take off our shoes, Christians, for the place we are standing is holy ground!

Just as God heard and saw the Israelites' suffering in Egypt, God has always seen the misery of His people. He has heard you and me crying out for spiritual and national revival, for mental acuity, for physical healing, and for emotional wholeness. God is concerned about our suffering, so He has come down to rescue us. In front of the burning bush, God told Moses, "So now, go, I am sending you to bring My people out of Egypt." But Moses said, "Who am I, that I should go? They won't listen to me!" Moses was not yet the great leader God would make of him; he tended smelly sheep on the backside of the desert. They would listen to people like Billy Graham or Chuck Swindoll. But me, Paula, holy? Who am I that I should go? They won't listen to me." But Jehovah God still commands us to go wherever the need is.

I am amazed as I have come to realize that I am holy—as holy as the ground upon which Moses was

standing. That ground was not holy in and of itself. It had not "done" anything to be holy. It was holy because Jehovah God was there; God's presence made it holy. Just like that ground upon which Moses stood, you and I are holy because Jehovah God is within us making us holy.

God has given to believers in Christ credentials, if you will the very righteousness of Jesus Christ. This is what makes us holy, the imputed righteousness of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. This is the basis of our relationship with God. And because He gave us Christ's righteousness, He also justified us, wiped our sins clean, redeemed us, restored our relationship. And by propitiation, Jesus Christ's atoning sacrifice turned Father God's wrath on sin away from us, where it rightly belonged, to put all of His wrath, indignation, and punishment for our sins on Jesus, the one perfect, sinless, Lamb of God. And, as if that weren't more than enough, He also gave us the Holy Spirit Himself, to dwell within us, and that is our holy ground!

It is true that when we disobey God, we sin and get out of fellowship with Him. Then, under the conviction of the Holy Spirit, we must (**ASAP**) confess our sins or sins (**1 John 1:9**), to be restored to fellowship with God,

Friend, I don't know about you, but I never put it together quite like this, never realized or grasped the incredible fact that the ground where I am standing is holy ground because the God of Holiness is dwelling in me! This amazing truth puts a whole new perspective on my outlook and on the "ground" I cover: where I go, with whom I go, and

what I do. Even more important is the attitude of my heart, for God looks on the heart. If the motive of our hearts is to fellowship with God and to glorify Him above all else, we experience the delights of His love.

The best keeps on getting better!

Just as God took a shepherd tending those smelly sheep on the backside of the desert, so God wants to take you and me and send us to set His people free by telling them the delights of His amazing grace.

"Oh, my dear, sweet Lord, send

a revival to us, personally, and to our nation as well, and let it begin with me!" This is not just my prayer, but the prayer of all God's people standing on holy ground.

"Therefore put on the armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand" **Ephesians 6:13NIV.**

"I sought for the greatness of the United States in her commanding harbors, her ample rivers, her fertile fields, and boundless forests, and it was not there. I sought for it in her rich mines, her vast world commerce, her public school system, and in her institutions of higher learning, and it was not there. I looked for it in her democratic Congress and her matchless Constitution—and it was not there. Not until I went into the churches of America and heard her pulpits flame with righteousness did I understand her genius and power. 

Note 3085. Some people think God does not like to be troubled by our constant coming and asking, but the way to trouble God is not to come.



THE LATIN AMERICA STORY

MY FIRST FORAY into Latin America came in January 1960. It was at that time that I fell in love with the Latin people living in the Western Hemisphere. The venue was an evangelistic crusade in Placetas, Cuba, located in the Santa Clara Province in beautiful central Cuba. Seventy were saved. Fifty years later, in 2010, Adam Nathanson (our friend and colleague who now serves as Portuguese/Spanish interpreter and is a missionary in Venezuela) and I were at First Baptist Church, Placetas, and found nine of the seventy in attendance. God is good!

In July 1992, I returned to Latin America, with Sue, to conduct prayer seminars in Puerto Rico, Venezuela, Costa Rica, and Mexico. Since then, there have been prayer seminars in South America: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay, and Venezuela. Other Caribbean nations include the Bahamas, Jamaica, Trinidad/Tobago. Of the nations in Latin America,

most attention has centered on Venezuela. In the ten trips to that nation, we have been in most sections of the nation, mobilizing believers to become **Lighthouses of Prayer**. In Latin America, thousands have been taught the purpose and power of prayer. Thousands have trusted Christ as their Savior. The harvest has been tremendous as the Word of God has gone forth.

We have **JGHM: Brazilian Branch**, under the able leadership of **Roberto & Joana Waisman**, committed to mobilizing **Lighthouses of Prayer** throughout Brazil.

March 17-23 we will be in **Porto Alegre, Brazil** where we have never been. **March 24-30** we will be in **Buenos Aires, Argentina**. **Luciana Bogarra** is the coordinator, assisted by his daughter, Antonela.

The budget is \$6,000. This will cover international travel for Adam (from Caracas, Venezuela), and me, as well as our domestic travel. It includes both Spanish and Portuguese prayer seminar workbooks and pens. It includes lodging/food for the team and a light snack for the participants. We need financial help, but beyond that we need prayer support. We are praying for one-hundred Ropeholders for these days in South America. As of Monday, February 13, 21 have given \$3,830. Our goal is 100 gifts.

Pray for traveling safety during the March 15-April 2 period that we will be on the road. Sue and I will drive to Murfreesboro, TN for the quarterly board meeting on Thursday, March 16, and I will fly out of Nashville that evening. Sue will be in Middle Tennessee and her Kentucky home during this time. Pray for both of us.

Nearly every Christian can repeat **Psalm 23**, one of the three "Shepherd Psalms," from memory, but not everyone from the heart. There are many ways to meditate upon this passage: perfect satisfaction (v 1); rest, quietness (v 2); restoration, guidance (v 3); consecration, joy (V 5); with me the Lord; beneath me green pastures; beside me still waters; before me a table; around me mine enemies; after me goodness and mercy; ahead of me happy eternity. Another meditation guide could be:

Happy life, (V 1); Happy death (v 4); Happy eternity (v 6).

Psalm 22 reveals the **Good Shepherd** who lays down His life for His sheep. **Psalm 23** unfolds the **Great Shepherd**. **Psalm 24** highlights the **Chief Shepherd**. In the New Testament, one of my favorite verses is full of encouragement. Speaking of the **Lord Jesus Christ**, we are reminded in **John 10** that it is the Lord Jesus Himself who is the **True Shepherd** who knows His sheep by name!
