Prayer Work



The arrangement of the Prayer Seminar content is intentional. It is biblical and practical. One reason that the six-hour seminar has been so well received around the world is that a participant receives the word, processes it in his mind as the Holy Spirit, our Teacher, does His work, and comes to the realization: “I can do that!” The result is another Lighthouse of Prayer at work.

A section of the Prayer Seminar Workbook deals with the three worlds that prayer touches: **HEAVEN**, Looking Toward God, and that is **WORSHIP** (page 7); **EARTH** Looking Toward People and Circumstances, and that is **WORK** (page 8); **HELL**, Looking toward **SATAN**, and that is **WARFARE** (PAGE 9).

The key passage of Scripture that teaches that prayer is the work that brings about **GREATER WORKS** is **John 14:12-14**. Many read this passage and ponder “Greater Works” without grasping the point John was making. “**ASKING THE FATHER IN JESUS’ NAME** (“that the Father may be glorified in the Son”) is what God has ordained to get His work done on earth.

The Sovereign God (the One who has final say) has ordained (laid out ahead of time) prayer as the tool to get His work done. Great men (**John Wesley, Charles Spurgeon, Armin Gesswein, Jerry Falwell** come to mind) have stated “**GOD WORKS ONLY IN CONCERT WITH THE PRAYING OF HIS PEOPLE.**” **Oswald Chambers** said, “*Prayer does not fit us for greater works; prayer is the greater work.*” **E. M. Bounds** maintained “Prayer is not the foe of work; it does not paralyze activity. It works mightily; prayer itself is the greatest work.” If these men’s avowals are true, why are we not doing prayer work?

Why schedule a prayer seminar? One of the outcomes of the prayer seminar is that the church becomes a praying church. Much of the work we are doing has little of the ring of a work “**with**” God. It may be a work “**for**” God, but it is surely not a work “**with**” God. Prayer is working “**WITH**” Him, not just “**FOR**” Him

During my last pastorate at **Immanuel Baptist Church, Newport News, Virginia**, the ground was laid for the worldwide prayer seminar ministry. The church organized a 24/7 prayer ministry with someone praying in the **PRAYER CHAPEL** every hour around the clock. **Prayer work was done and the windows of Heaven were opened.** I personally baptized over 100 each of the last two years of that ministry. The result was a **REVIVAL OF PRAYER IN THE LIVES OF INDIVIDUALS. GOD IS ABLE! GOD IS WILLING! GOD IS WAITING FOR HIS PEOPLE TO DO THE PRAYER WORK.**

2023: Troubled Times The Bible Has the Answer

Take a look in **Mark 13**. The chapter begins with a rather complex apocalyptic passage that draws a grim picture of the future. We are to expect tragedy and suffering in this world. All around us we are beholding the fulfillment of this prediction. Things will continue to worsen with the fulfillment of an ancient prophecy by Daniel, that signifies the end is near (v 14). And after that things will get even worse (vv 15-23).

Mark shares three things to encourage believers. First, Jesus knew the terrible things that will happen. God is not surprised and remains in control of history. Second, we are encouraged by the promise of God’s presence; the Holy Spirit is in us to help. Third, and most important, Jesus will come again with “great power and glory” (v 26). In the end, God will set things right. And we’re told to wait and watch (vv 33-35). “What I say to you, I say to everyone: ‘Watch!’” (v 37).

Notes from My Bible
